Stanley Wong

Dr. Wong was appointed Member of the Competition Authority as of February 2006 and also serves as Director of the Mergers Division. From 2006 to 2008 he served as Director of the Monopolies Division. From 2006 to 2008, he led the Grocery Monitor Project which produced a 3-volume report on the wholesale and retailer segments of the Irish grocery sector.

Among his duties, he has represented the Authority in consultations by the European Commission on major case decisions and policy initiatives such as private actions and Article 82 guidance. He is also an active participant in the work of the OECD and the International Competition Network.

He frequently speaks and lectures on competition law and policy. In January 2009, at the request of the European Commission he made workshop presentations on Irish and European competition laws to the Chinese competition authorities in Beijing, China, under the auspices of the EU-China Trade Project. In March 2009 he chaired the panel on predatory pricing at the Workshop of ICN Unilateral Conduct Working Group held in Washington, DC.

Prior to joining the Competition Authority he was a Partner and head of the competition law practice in Canadian law firm Davis & Company LLP. He has served as Chair of the National Competition Law Section of the Canadian Bar Association in 2000-2001

He is qualified as an economist and a lawyer. Prior to entering the practice of law in 1984, he was Associate Professor of Economics at Carleton University, Ottawa. He has two degrees in economics (B.A., Hons., Simon Fraser University and Ph.D., University of Cambridge, King's College) and a LL.B. degree from the University of Toronto.

Dr. Wong is admitted to practice law as a barrister and solicitor in Ontario and British Columbia, Canada and as a solicitor in England and Wales (non-practicing). He has extensive experience as litigation and advisory counsel on competition matters. In private practice, he was recognized internationally as a leading competition lawyer.
